

(e)mission (im)possible MOOC Presentation and Instructions

Dear Participants,

Welcome on board! We are thrilled to share with you the MOOC of (e)mission (im)possible! We present here some key information to facilitate your understanding of the e-learning process.

The MOOC's goal is to mainstream key competences on climate action among current and future professionals in the field of development cooperation and humanitarian aid.

It is a free online training path, of about 25 hours, which addresses 4 main themes, divided into clusters:

- A. **The human dimension of climate change:** liabilities, climate justice and human rights
- B. **Climate change basics:** climate science and international governance
- C. **Organisations' actions** to curb emissions and to improve their climate action
- D. **Engaging other actors in change:** donors, partners, local communities and policy makers.

At the bottom of the page in the 'Additional Resources' section you will find:

- A navigation guide with detailed instructions on how to register on the platform and enrol for the course.
- The course programme to find out how the modules (clusters) and lessons are organised.

We recommend following the **modules and lessons in order** (Cluster A to D, from lesson A.1 to A.2 etc. to B.1.1, B.1.2, B.2.1 etc. to D.2.2).

Depending on your availability, interests and needs, you can freely choose to access all or part of the content offered, to watch the video lectures, to study specific topics in depth and to assess your knowledge acquisition through tests.

In case you do not wish to follow the order of the clusters, you can start wherever you like, but within the module you will have to follow the lessons in sequential order. (E.g. you can start with Cluster C, but to view lesson C.2, you must necessarily complete C.1).



Lessons:

Each cluster consists of a series of lessons structured in:

- List of learning outcomes
- List of contents
- Youtube video lesson (the duration of the videos can vary from 4 to 11 minutes).
For each Youtube lesson, you can activate subtitles in your language. The course has been recorded in English and Spanish and subtitles have been added for Italian, Portuguese and French.

IMPORTANT: You will have to watch the videos in their entirety in order to move on to the next lesson.

Other information:

Within each lesson you will also find:

- The script of the video lesson (in your language).
- The slides (in English only) shown during the video can be found at the bottom of each lesson page in the 'Lesson Resources' section.
- The bibliography

Compulsory materials:

The majority of lessons involve **additional compulsory readings or videos**. These may be documents, other external lectures or documentaries. They are mostly available in all languages.

- For videos: click on the Youtube link and select the automatic subtitles in your language.
- For documents: they are already provided in your language or, if they are in English, you can use a free online automatic translator of your choice (e.g. <http://www.deepl.com/translator>). Use it, if you need it, to automatically translate documents that are only available in English.

Test:

To test the knowledge acquired and for the purpose of obtaining ECTS, there are two tests within the course:

- An **intermediate test** of 12 questions related to clusters A and B (12 minutes time).
- A **final test** of 24 questions relating to clusters C and D (25 minutes' time).





These are multiple choice questions with only one correct answer.

Make sure you are well prepared and study the compulsory materials before you take the test! To pass the tests, you must **answer at least 70 per cent of the questions correctly**, but re-attempts are allowed.

Certificate:

To obtain the certificate and course credits, *ECTS (European Credit Transfer System)*, the requirements are:

- Complete 100% of the lessons present in the course.
- Pass each of the two tests in the course with **at least 70% of the answers correct**.
- Complete the course by **31 October 2024**. After this date, the course will remain accessible on the platform, but no credits will be released.
